Italy's Decade of War: 1935-45 in International Perspective

6-7 September 2016
University of Strathclyde, Glasgow.

From the invasion of Abyssinia to the end of World War II, Italy experienced a decade of war. This conference aims to re-evaluate the history of the Italian experience during this ten-year period with a unifying international perspective

Possible topics might include:

- Italian Fascism's ideology and militarism
- The Abyssinian crisis and its regional consequences
- Italy's geopolitical revisionism in the Mediterranean
- Fascist military participation in the Spanish Civil War
- Italy's role in appeasement
- Italian foreign relations, especially with Germany, France, Britain, United States, Spain
- Italy's political and military role in the Middle East and North Africa
- The war in the Mediterranean
- Italian occupations in World War Two
- Allied Italian campaign, 1943-45
- Memories and representations of Italy's decade of war

This conference aims to bring together scholars working in the fields of military, political, diplomatic, international, colonial, transnational, and comparative history, and encourages inter-disciplinary contributions. The conference organisers aim to publish selected papers in an edited volume and a journal special issue. We invite proposals for 20-25 minute papers on any aspect of the conference theme. Proposals for panels of two or three papers are particularly welcome.
